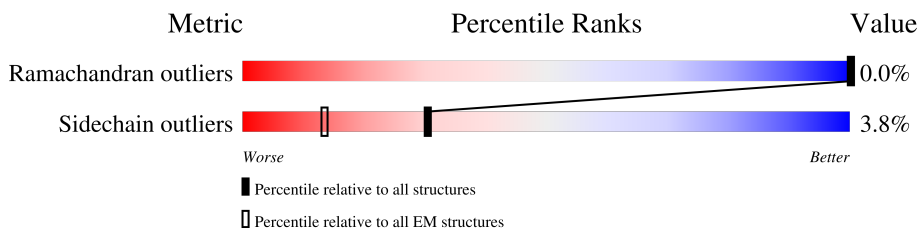

A grey segment represents the fraction of residues that are not modelled. The numeric value for each fraction is indicated below the corresponding segment, with a dot representing fractions $\leq 5\%$. The upper red bar (where present) indicates the fraction of residues that have poor fit to the EM map (all-atom inclusion $< 40\%$). The numeric value is given above the bar.

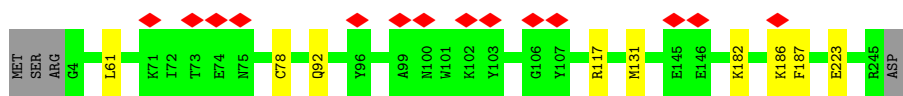


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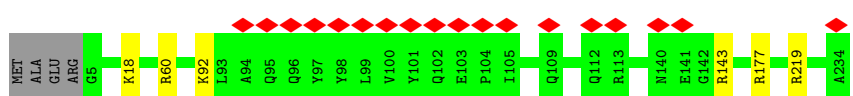
- Molecule 11: 26S proteasome regulatory subunit 6A



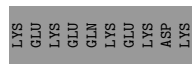
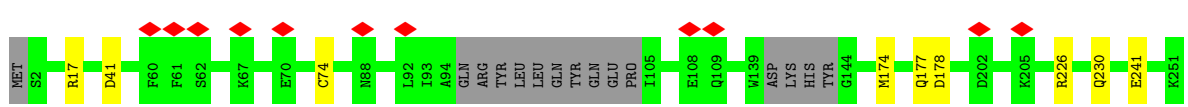
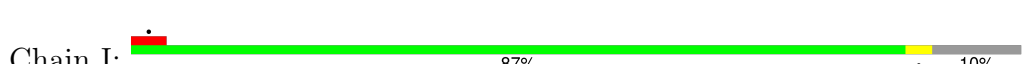
- Molecule 12: Proteasome subunit alpha type-6



- Molecule 13: Proteasome subunit alpha type-2

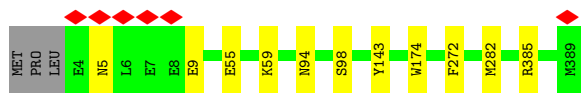


- Molecule 14: Proteasome subunit alpha type-4

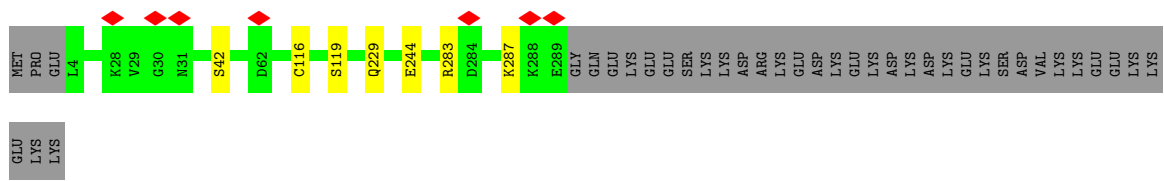
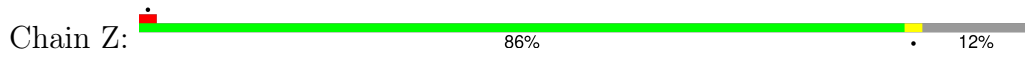


- Molecule 15: Proteasome subunit alpha type-7

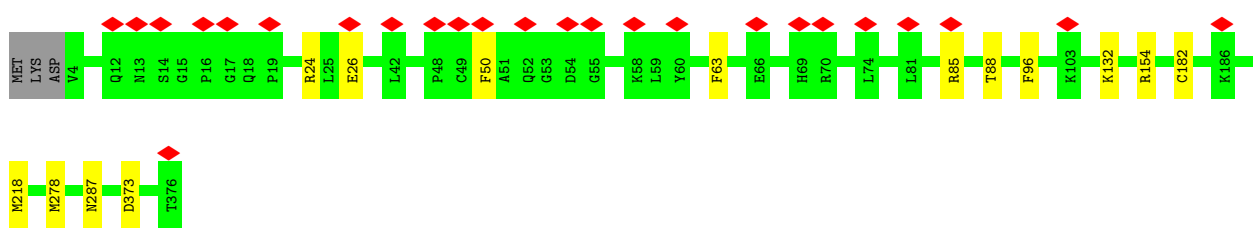




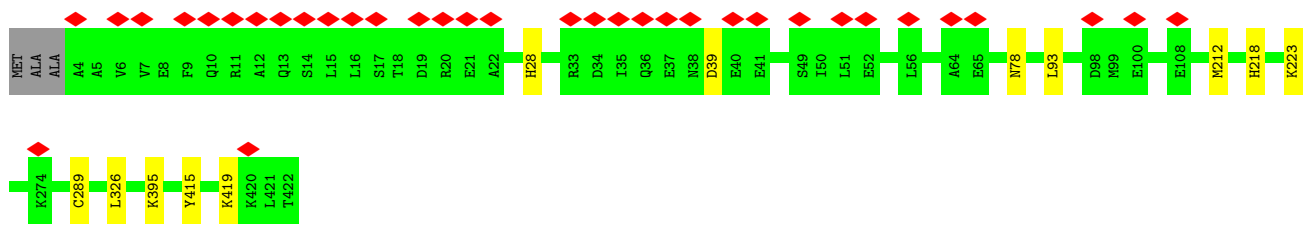
- Molecule 25: 26S proteasome non-ATPase regulatory subunit 7

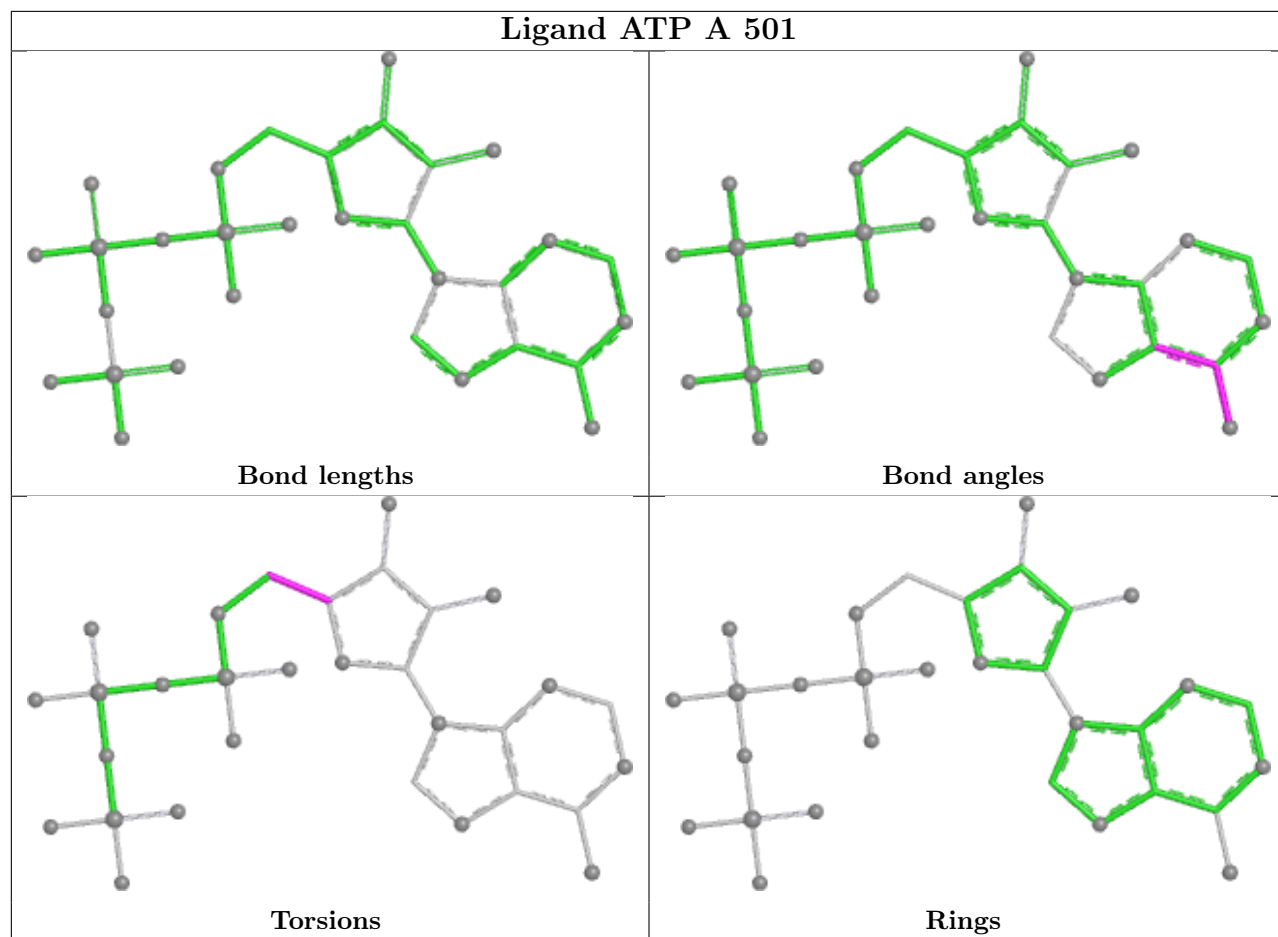
The following is a two-dimensional graphical depiction of Mogul quality analysis of bond lengths, bond angles, torsion angles, and ring geometry for all instances of the Ligand of Interest. 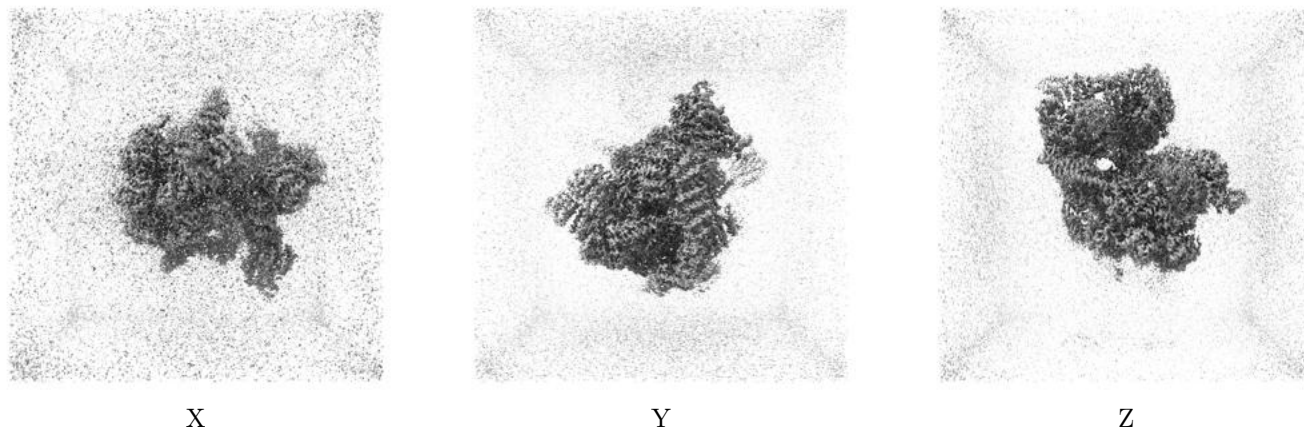

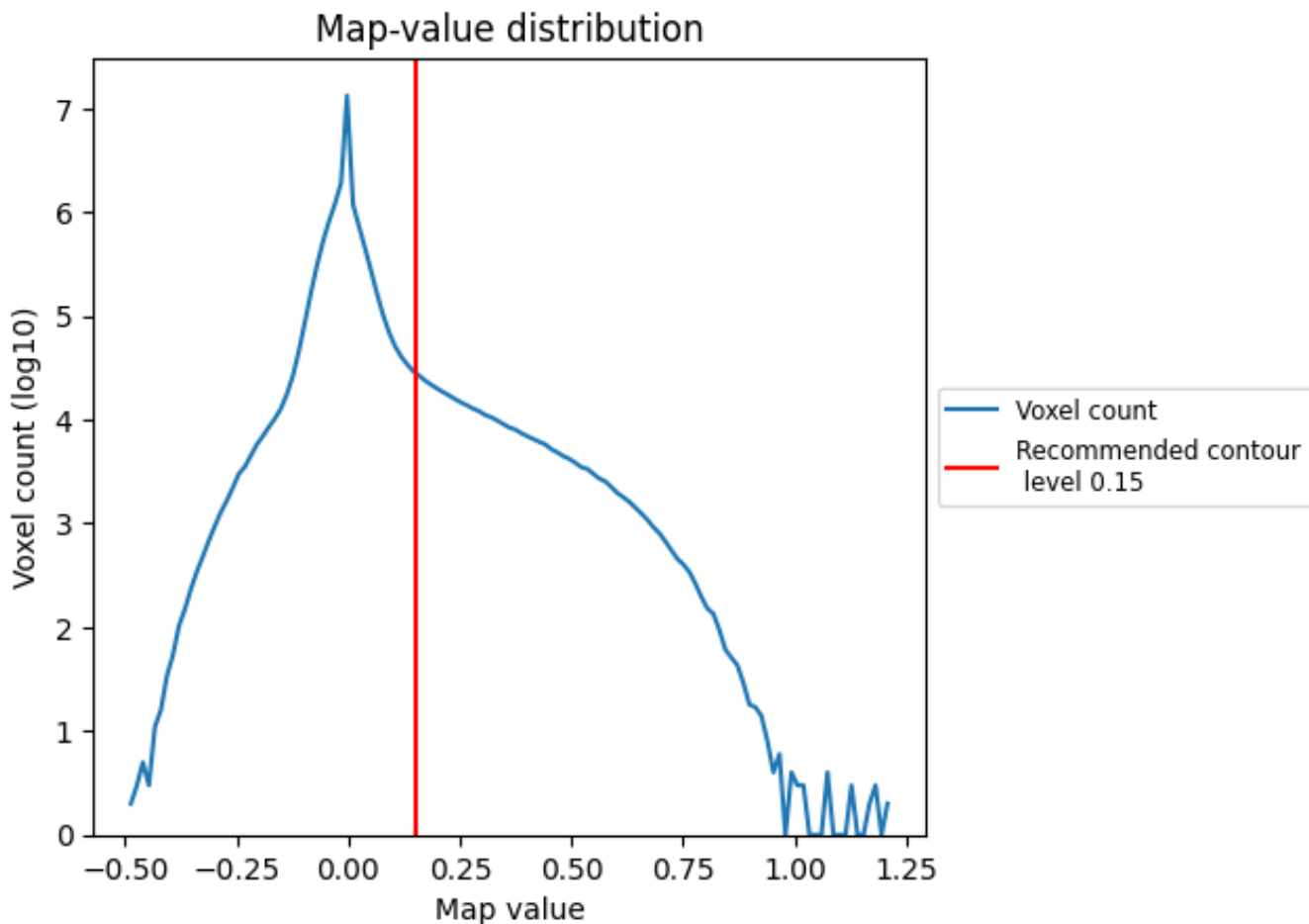

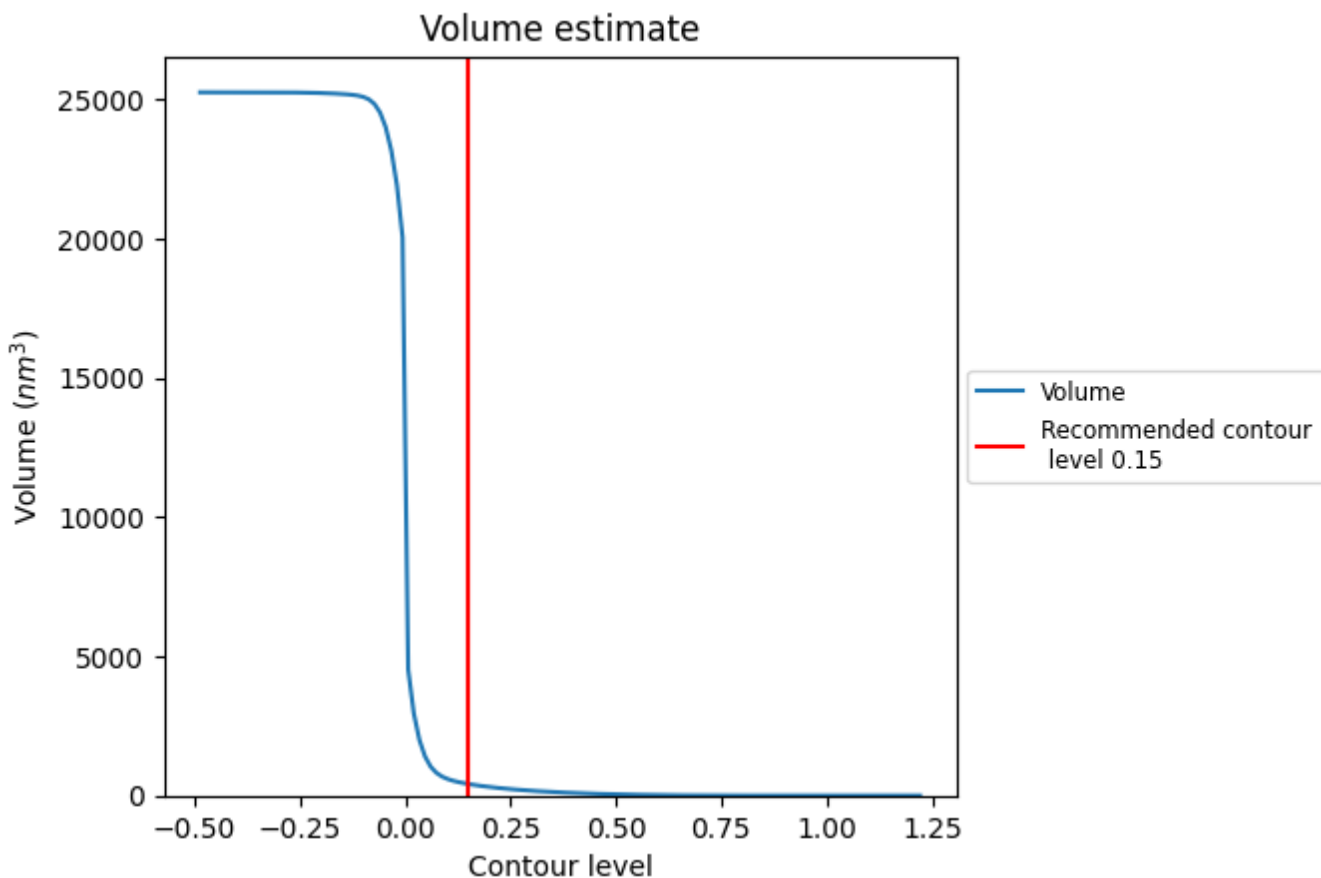

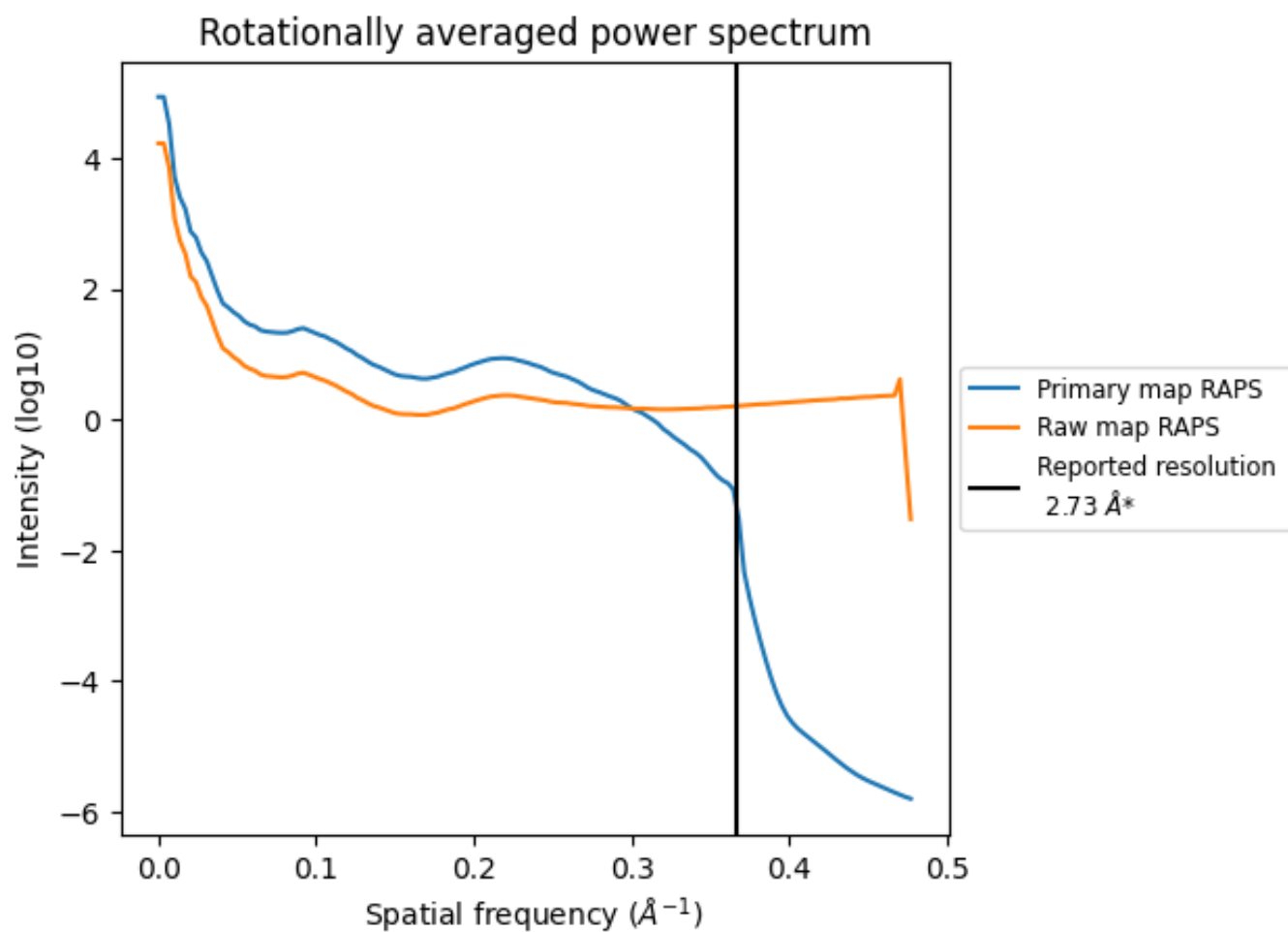

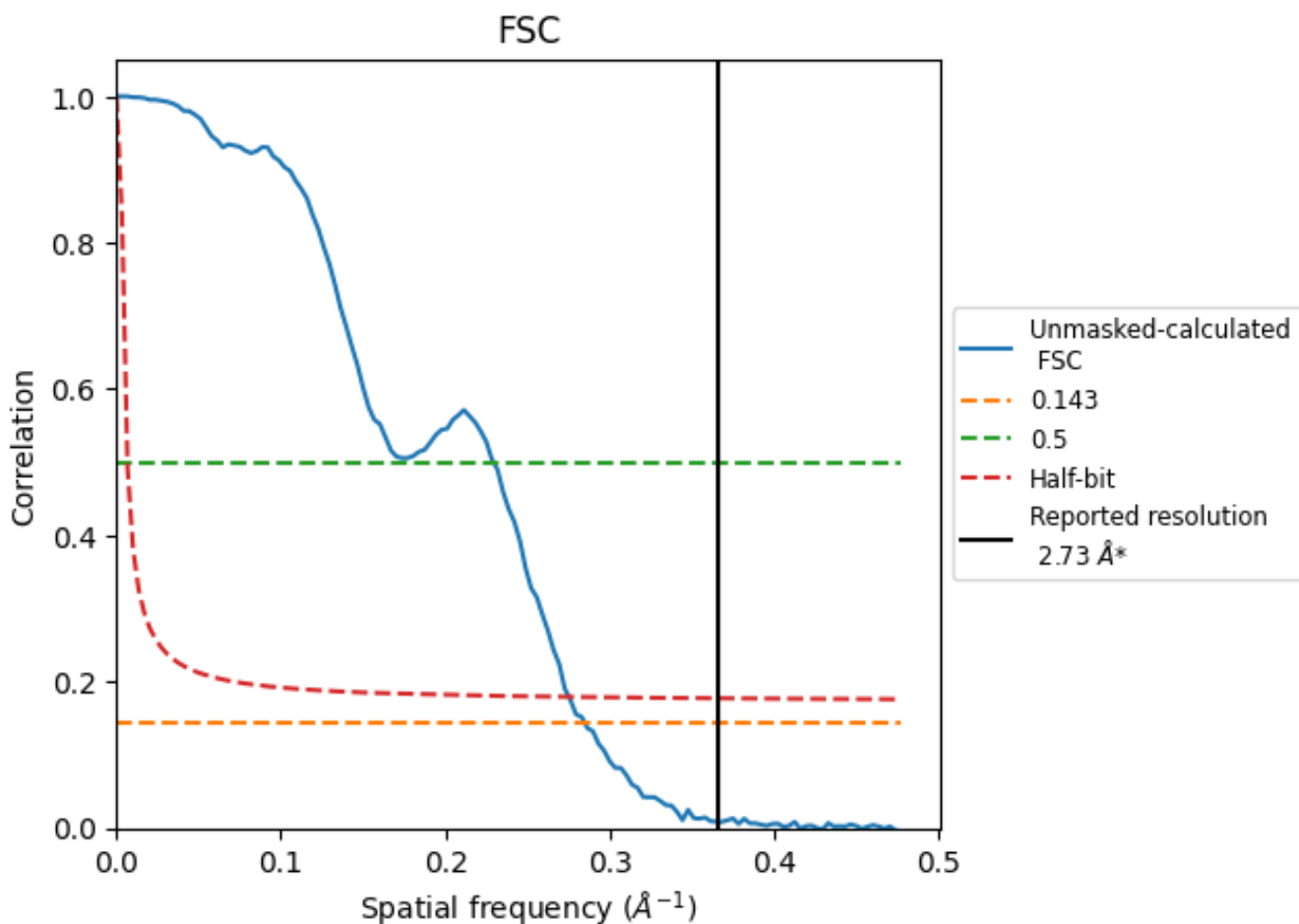

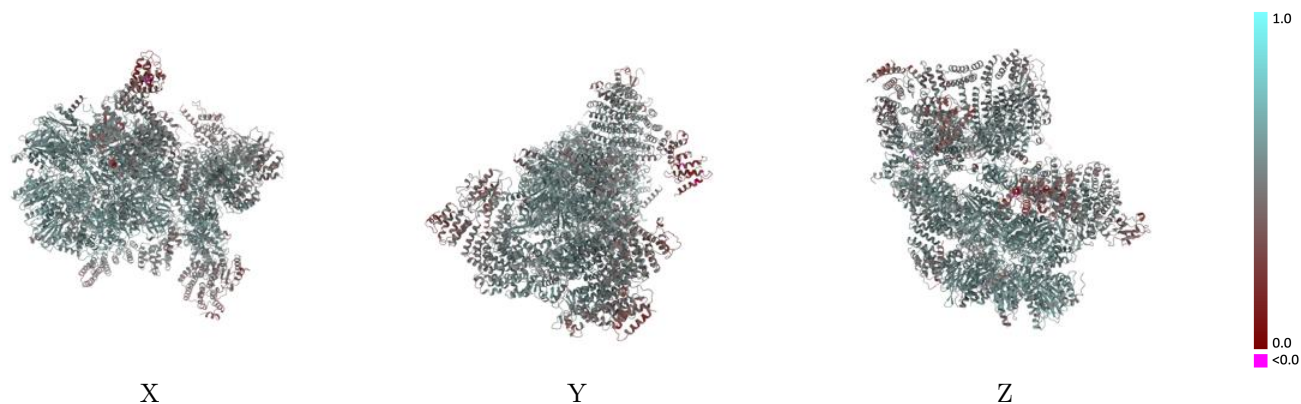

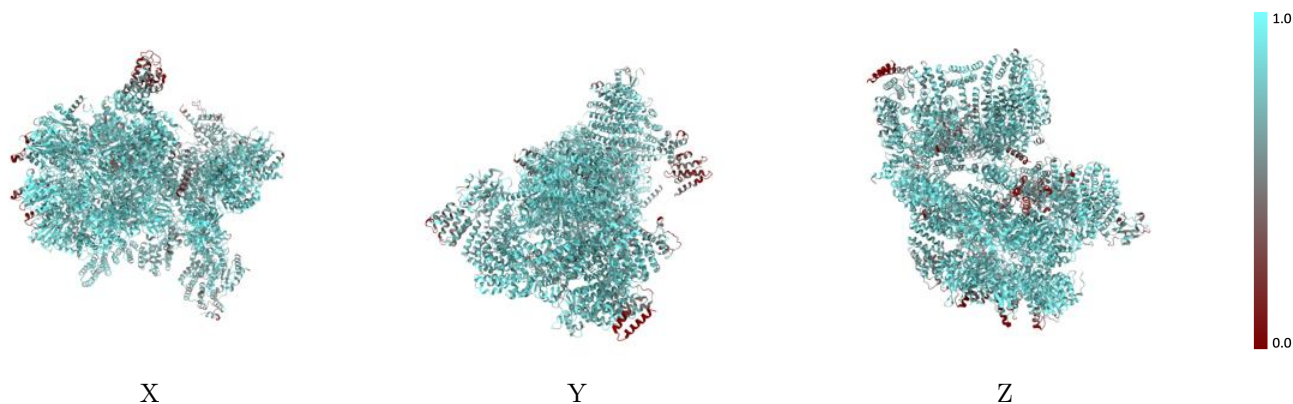

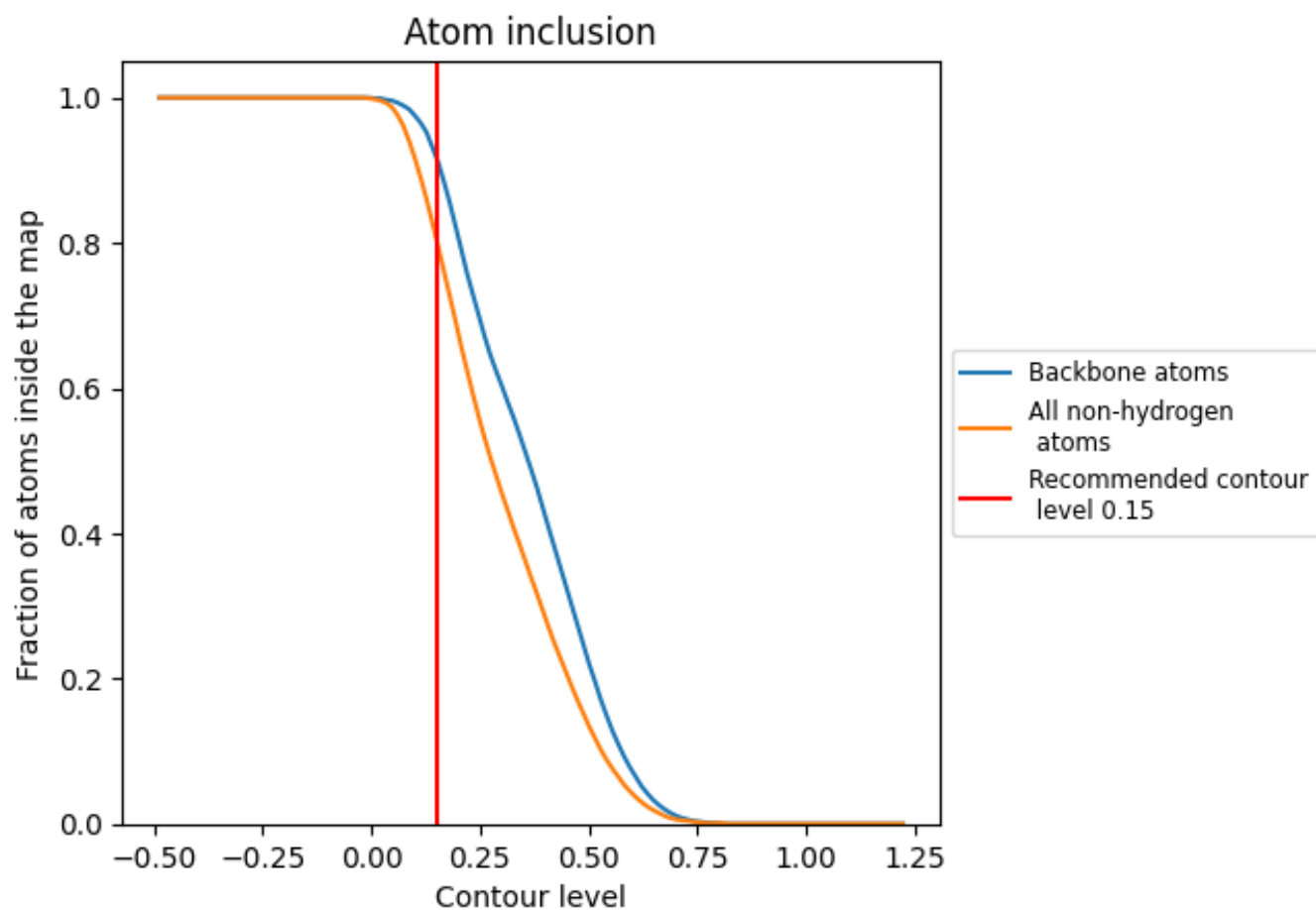
